Dear colleagues

In light of last week's announcement from WorkSafe that the department has been charged for alleged breaches of the Occupational Health and Safety Act regarding Victoria's initial hotel quarantine program, I wanted to provide some important and early points of clarification for you.

As an executive, we are aware that the media coverage on Wednesday and the fact of the prosecution may have resulted in curiosity, concern and worry for some of you and no doubt raised some questions, particularly if you or someone you know was either involved in the WorkSafe investigation, the hotel quarantine operation. This is a natural reaction to have.

Given the charges were only issued on Wednesday, the department has not yet received all the relevant information from WorkSafe, however here are some things that are important for you to know:

- The charges have been issued against the Department of Health
- WorkSafe have advised that no individuals from the department are, or will be, charged
- We are not aware of the status of WorkSafe's position regarding other parties involved in the hotel quarantine operation
- There is an administrative hearing scheduled for 22 October which is used for the purpose of setting a timetable for the proceedings no witnesses are called at these hearings
- Staff who were involved in the WorkSafe investigation will be contacted individually by the department's legal team (supported by the department's employee wellbeing and support team) to provide more detail on process, next steps and specialised wellbeing support
- If you:
 - o were involved with the hotel quarantine inquiry and worked in the hotel quarantine operation and were not involved in the WorkSafe investigation; or
 - o worked in the hotel quarantine operation and were <u>not</u> involved in the hotel quarantine inquiry and <u>were not</u> involved in the WorkSafe investigation,

it is extremely unlikely that you will be to be involved in any way with the WorkSafe prosecution

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• Unfortunately, matters such as these can continue for some time and this really depends on whether the matter is settled or whether the matter proceeds to trial. If a matter goes to trial it is likely that it won't be heard for at another 12 months with intermittent court dates in between. It is too early to determine how this matter will resolve.

I hope that this has answered some of the questions you have.

The impacts of these sorts of events are far ranging and varied. Everyone seeks support in different ways. For the majority of us the natural first inclination is to seek support from close and trusted friends, family and colleagues.

If you feel you need or want a little more than that, the <u>Employee Wellbeing and Support Program</u> is available to provide confidential support to all employees and their immediate family members. Support is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, via telephone or video conference. Please call Converge International on 1300 687 327 and request immediate support if you need it, or to book an appointment for a time that suits you.

The <u>Peer Support Network</u> offers informal and confidential support at short notice to departmental staff members. It can help staff members experiencing difficulties at work or at home to access more formal support options. The peer supporters are departmental staff members who volunteer their time to support their colleagues using a model based on active listening, clarification, navigation and referral to appropriate support services. The network operates Monday to Friday during business hours and peers are currently available via telephone and Teams. Contact details for all peer supporters can be found on the <u>Health, Safety and Wellbeing sharepoint page</u>.

If you have any other initial questions or concerns, please chat to your manager or executive in the first instance.

Dear Euan,

I am sorry that I was unable to reach you on the phone just now.

Further to my voicemail message, I wish to advise you that WorkSafe has this morning filed charges against the Victorian Department of Health in relation to Operation Soteria, Victoria's initial hotel quarantine program.

There are 58 charges in total, all of which relate to alleged failures to take adequate steps to establish infection prevention and control measures at hotels used in the quarantine program between March and July 2020.

Included in this are 17 alleged breaches of section 21(1) of the Occupational Health and Safety Act in that the department failed to provide and maintain, as far as reasonably practicable, a working environment that was safe and without risks to health for the Department's employees.

A further 41 charges relate to alleged breaches of section 23 (1) of the OHS Act, in that the department failed to ensure, so far as was reasonably practicable, that persons other than employees were not exposed to risks to their health and safety arising from conduct of the Department's undertaking.

WorkSafe will shortly publish a media statement providing some high-level details about the charges and the investigation. Beyond that we do not intend to make any further public comment, given that this matter is now before the courts.

PRE-HEARING DISCLOSURE NOTICE FOR MATTERS TO BE DETERMINED BY A **COMMITTAL PROCEEDING**

(Section 13 of the Criminal Procedure Act 2009)

You have been charged with an indictable offence.

You should speak to a legal practitioner (a lawyer) immediately.

How can you get information about your charge?

Your charge-sheet will have some information about the charge.

More information about the charge will be provided to you when the informant (the person who charged you) gives you a hand-up brief or plea brief.

Hand-up Brief:

The informant must give you a hand-up brief containing the evidence on which they rely to prove the charge against you and a statement that you have no previous convictions or a copy of your criminal record by the date fixed by the Court at the filing hearing.

Plea Brief:

If you have decided to plead quilty to the charge the informant may give you a plea brief. The informant may only give you a plea brief if you have given your written consent. You should obtain legal advice before providing your written consent.

Continuing obligation of disclosure:

The informant has an obligation to disclose to you any information, document or thing that comes into their possession after a hand-up brief is given to you. The informant must give you a copy of the information or list of things as soon as possible after it comes into their possession. However, the informant does not have an obligation to disclose to you any information, document or thing if the informant believes that doing so will result in the disclosure to you of child abuse material. In that case, you may apply to the Court for an order requiring the informant to provide, or make available for inspection, the information, document or thing.

Inspection of exhibits

You may inspect any of the items listed in a hand-up brief at a time and place agreed with the informant.
